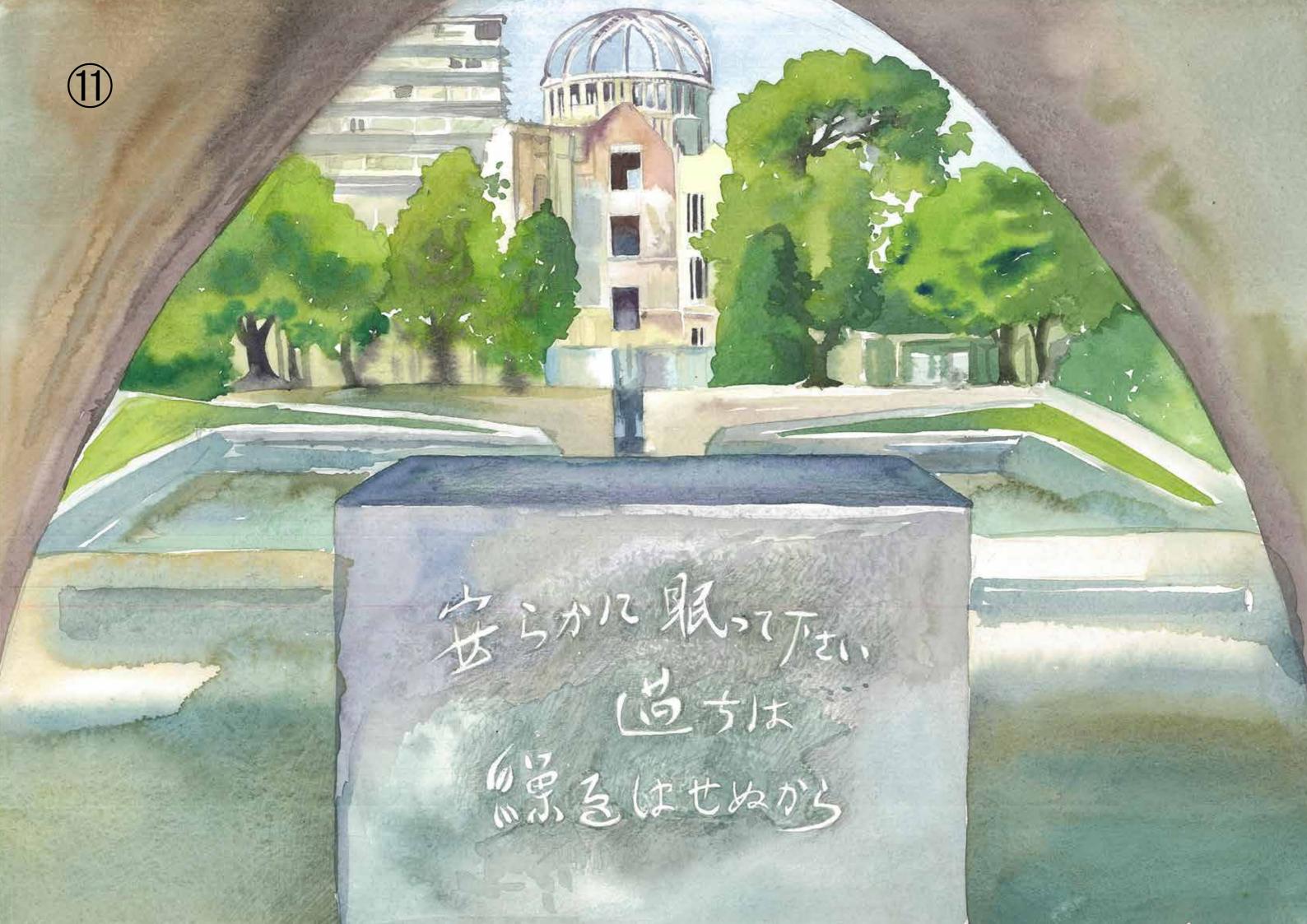
Kei has but one wish:
