It was a terrifying bomb, a nuclear weapon, that had been dropped.





Nws yog ib lub foob pob txaus ntshai, riam phom nuclear, uas tau poob lawm.



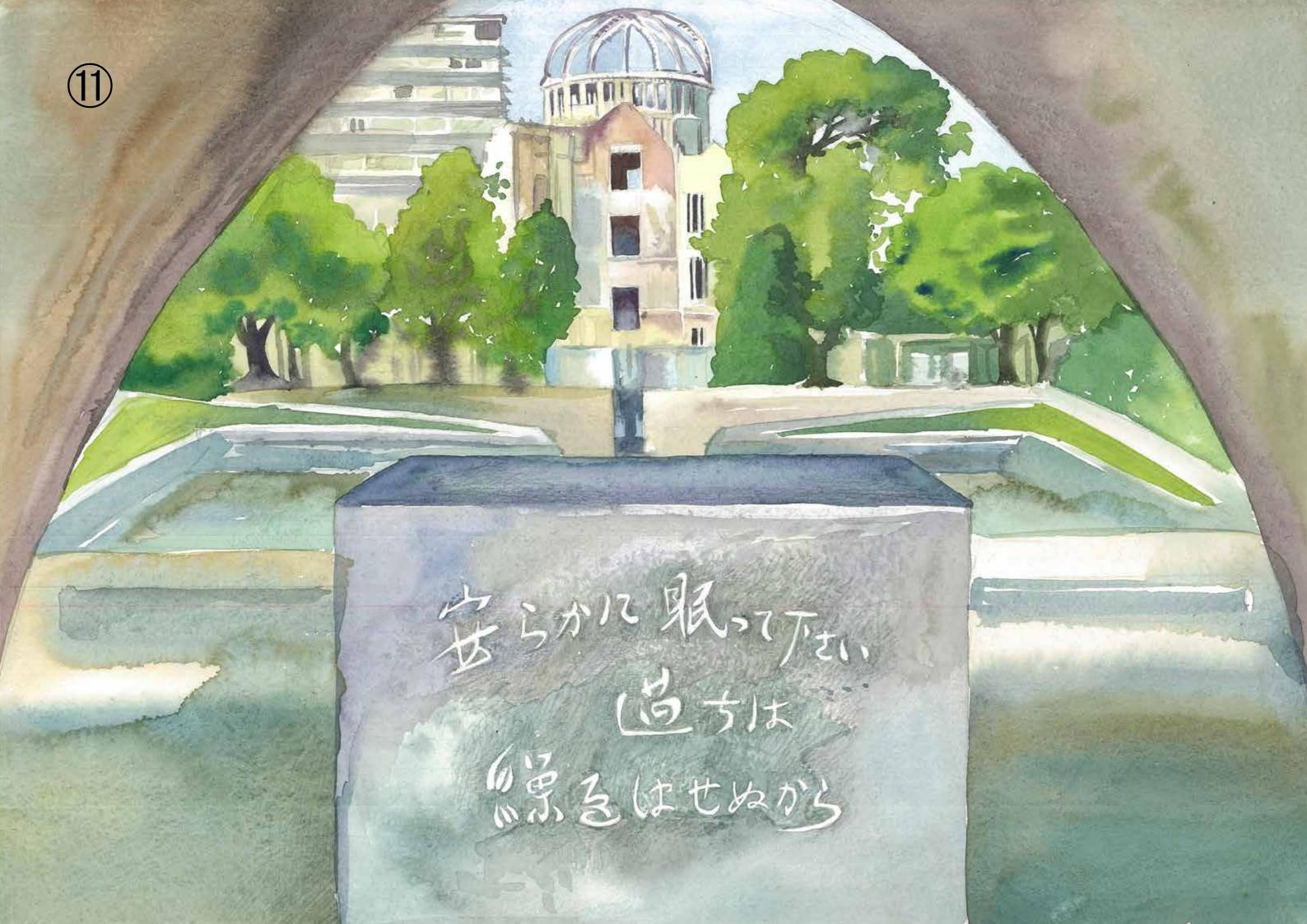
Kei has but one wish:
